#### Report of Members Meeting - Tuesday 2 January 2024

We held our first meeting of the New Year on 2nd January in the Connect Centre on Model School Road. The Chairman, John Pinkerton, in welcoming the members, speculated as to whether the record size of the audience (over 50% of the membership) was due to a desire to get out of the house after the Christmas/New Year festivities or to hear the guest speaker, retired Appeal Court Judge, the Right Hon. Sir Paul Girvan. He suggested the later and this proved to be well founded.

Sir Paul gave a fascinating account of his entry into the Law, his life as a junior barrister, then as a QC and his elevation to the Bench as a Judge of the High Court. His final years before retiring were as an Appeal Court judge and a member of the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council. To finish his talk he demonstrated the different court robes that he would have worn in the various courts in which he sat.

His talk was extremely well received by the members and after a brief question and answer session the vote of thanks was proposed by Patricia Crossley. The Chairman also thanked Sir Paul for his talk and in closing reminded the members that the next monthly meeting would be on Tuesday 6th February in the Connect Centre.

Our chairman also noted that: The Inner Wheel Club of Ballymoney (to which organisation a number of our own members belong) is holding its annual Quiz Night on Wednesday 7th February in the Royal British Legion hall in Towhead Street. It starts at 7.30 pm and the cost is  $\pm 5.00$  per person. It is always a very enjoyable evening and is well worth supporting as the proceeds will help towards funding a number local charities.

#### Bu3a Family and Local History Group - 16 January 2024

Fifteen of our members attended our meeting on a snowy Tuesday, 16<sup>th</sup> January 2024. We were privileged to have an illustrated talk from our BU3A Chairman John Pinkerton entitled "The Pinkertons of Seacon". Being an 8<sup>th</sup> consecutive John Pinkerton in his family, John traced his family history back to migrants from Scotland in the mid 17<sup>th</sup> century. He related his family's background as farmers, linen merchants and latterly the last 3 generations as lawyers. His great great grandfather John Pinkerton (1845-1908) had served as an MP at Westminster for Galway 1886-1900, and as a JP and tenant farmer, was a leading speaker and organiser of the Tenant-Right Campaign.

Our John was 3<sup>rd</sup> generation lawyer in Ballymoney, with all 3 generations serving as Presidents of the Law Society in N Ireland, a unique record for UK lawyers. John's father had served as a "Secret Listener" collecting important radio communications to be passed on to Bletchley Park during World War II. His uncle Tom also had also served in the RAF during WW II and had received many distinguished service medals. John illustrated his talk with several manuscripts, records and photos of historical family heirlooms. Our group thoroughly enjoyed John's presentation and would recommend that John repeats his talk for the full Monthly Members Meeting sometime in the future.

Our next scheduled event will be a visit to PRONI (Public Records of N Ireland) on Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> February 2024. We plan to leave Ballymoney by train at 9-30am and return arriving by train to Ballymoney at 5-30pm. #### Gardening – 25 January 2024

We had a rather small meeting on Thursday; however a very good demonstration dividing plants for planting out. Davy gave us ideas on how to prune blackcurrants, cutting out the old growth hard back as they fruit on new growth. Gooseberries didn't need much pruning as they fruit on older branches. Plum and apple trees need pruning to a light bulb shape. Frances had a selection of perennials, she demonstrating how to separate roots either with two forks or as she uses a saw. Such plants as monkshood, primroses, and a ground cover plant ajuga reptans. We were given cuttings to try our skills at growing them.

A really informative demonstration of separating perennials and pruning fruit trees.
