Report of Members Meeting - 6 February 2024

The guest speaker at February's Ballymoney u3a Meeting was Eddie Lynch the Commissioner for Older People in Northern Ireland.

Eddie outlined the main priorities of his role and explained that the post of Commissioner for Older People NI was established in 2011.

His main role is to protect and promote the rights of older people which means he is involved with the various statutory and voluntary agencies who provide services to this age groups as well as advising on government policy.

His duties are wide ranging from health and social care to housing, fuel costs and treatment of residents in care homes to transport, IT scams and tackling ageism in society. One notable case was a major investigation in allegations of elder abuse at Dunmurry Care Home which led to Adult Safeguarding legislation being introduced.

His office was heavily involved during the Covid pandemic dealing with issues raised by individuals and organisations. He is a Core Participant in the current Covid-19 enquiry and hopes that his contribution will help to avoid mistakes made during the pandemic happening should a future situation of this nature arise.

He then spent some time informing members on the various IT and banking scams which are increasingly prevalent. In conjunction with the PSNI, his office has formed Scamwise to monitor and raise awareness among older people of the dangers involved.

All in all it was a very educational meeting and members appreciated all the information they had been given.
