She outlined the nature of some of these from the more old fashioned ones where entry was gained to houses by pretending to be legitimate visitors such as officials to more modern ones involving bogus phone calls and contacts via IT devices.

She warned the audience that whilst everyone could fall victim to these that older people were often targeted by the criminals in the belief that they were likely to be more easily tricked and therefore were possibly more vulnerable.

After Ms Pat Crossely had given the vote of thanks to the speaker the chairman thanked all those who came to what was a very well attended meeting particularly given the inclement weather conditions.

The morning concluded with him reminding the audience that preparation was well underway for our 10th anniversary celebration with the formation of a sub-committee under the leadership of Ms Marie. Hegarty those who felt they may be able to contribute to the planning of activities were asked to contact her.

Finally the next meeting of the Ballymoney u3a was announced as being on 4th February 2025 in the Connect Centre at 11.00


